RESOLUTION NO. 23/2 67

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING FUNDING AND COMPLETION OF A COMPREHENSIVE GROUNDWATER ANALYSIS IN AND AROUND THE BADGER ARMY AMMUNITION PLANT, SAUK COUNTY, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, substances were used in the production of propellants during its active years at the Badger Army Ammunition Plant that are known to be hazardous to human beings; and,

WHEREAS, contamination has been confirmed in groundwater monitoring wells at the plant boundary; and,

WHEREAS, the U.S. Army has detected contamination in groundwater monitoring wells as far as one mile from known hazardous waste disposal sites at Badger; and,

WHEREAS, this same groundwater aquifer provides a potable water supply to nearly 10,000 residents within the southern half of a four-mile radius of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant; and,

WHEREAS, Plan Element 2.3.3 of the 2001 Badger Reuse Plan calls for the U.S. Army to ensure that groundwater in and around Badger shall meet the Wisconsin DNR's preventative action limit (PAL) and in general to complete the highest quality cleanup of the Badger property's contaminated land, water, buildings and infrastructure in a timely manner; and,

WHEREAS, the potential impact of this contamination may have adverse affects on the future land uses and economic growth of the region if not better understood and effectively addressed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, that a comprehensive analysis of the lateral and vertical groundwater flows within a vicinity of the Badger Army Ammunition Plant be conducted to better understand, predict and identify measures that will assure the safety of the existing and future regional drinking water supply; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the necessary federal appropriations be provided to Sauk County as a representative of the Badger Intergovernmental Group and the Badger Interim Oversight and Management Commission to fund said comprehensive analysis.
