Dear Chairman Krueger:

Attached please find Resolution 03-2008 passed by the Town Board for the Town of Greenfield in Sauk County. The purpose of the resolution is to support a request in the form of a petition signed by 30 residents and landowners directly in the flow of Clark Creek.

As you are aware, Clark Creek flooding on June 12, 2008 created a flooding disaster for the residents living along the creek and also to State Hwy 113. The residents along the creek had to be evacuated due to high rushing water. The highway damage was so extensive that is was closed for several weeks until major repairs could be completed. The residential homes were badly damaged and the surrounding yards were eroded to 10 ft. gullies or covered with several feet of sand and debris including downed trees. One business was completely destroyed due to a mud slid. These same areas have been badly damaged due to flooding of the creek on 4 other separate occasions starting in July, 1993. The citizens are understandably, concerned about their personal safety and loss of personal and business property.

As a result, 30 residents presented a petition to the Town Board requesting the rerouting of the creek. The board agreed and passed the resolution to support their efforts and to contact and work with state and local officials to reroute Clark Creek to prevent further damages to their properties and State Hwy 113.

The Town of Greenfield and its Clark Creek area residents are eager to proceed with a solution and the Board invites your comments and participation. If you or your staff members would please contact the Board and resident's spokesman to discuss proposals, we would be happy to meet with you.

#### TOWN OF GREENFIELD RESOLUTION NO. <u>03-2008</u>

WHEREAS, the Town of Greenfield experienced extreme flooding earlier this year that caused severe damage in the Township;

WHEREAS, part of that damage was caused by the flooding of Clark Creek;

WHEREAS, flooding from Clark Creek resulted in damage to several homes of Town residents, severe damage to Highway 113, a main thoroughfare that serves the Town, such that the road was closed and remained closed for several weeks and has remained in a state of disrepair since the flooding event;

WHEREAS, the same areas that experienced flooding this year have been damaged by floods in prior years, July 17, 1993, June 17, 1996, June 1, 2000, July 10, 2000 and June 12, 2008, such that the flooding is a continuing and reoccurring problem for the Town and its residents;

WHEREAS, thirty (30) concerned citizens have filed a petition with the Town of Greenfield for the re-routing of Clark Creek to offer flood prevention now and in the future and to provide for personal safety and for the preservation and protection of business, personal and real property;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town of Greenfield hereby declares its support for the citizens' initiative and flood prevention in the Township, including investigation of the possibility of re-routing Clark Creek and consideration of other flood prevention and mitigation measures that may be taken to improve the public health and safety and will not inhibit the efforts of FEMA, the State of Wisconsin or Sauk County with regard to the same.

Sauk County needs to stay in the nursing home business if for no other reason than Alzheimer's disease. People are living longer than ever before, and Alzheimer's disease will soon be diagnosed in record numbers. Where will residents go who lived all their lives and paid taxes in Sauk County when private nursing homes turn them away because they are too difficult to handle?

I understand that the Board recently overturned the previous Board's decision to invest in silver LEED certification. Constructing a nursing home is similar to funding public education. You invest up front for payback down the road. I urge you to use good quality materials and to make decisions based upon future energy efficiency and cost savings.

Insulated concrete forms (ICFs) are an excellent choice for construction when installed by a trained work force such as union trained members of the International Union of Bricklayers and Allied Craftworkers (IUBAC). This type of poured concrete wall can either be the foundation wall or the whole back-up wall system, below and above grade. Building with ICFs offers a significant upgrade in energy efficiency, durability, and lifecycle cost over using brick veneer on top of a metal stud or wood stud back-up wall.

The people elected you to represent them. Nobody ever said it would be easy. If it was, everyone would want to do it. It is your job to do what is in the best interests of Sauk County. Do not allow this nursing home to be built on the cheap.
