**Innovation** is proactively planning for the future and supporting a culture that fosters new ideas and ways of providing services

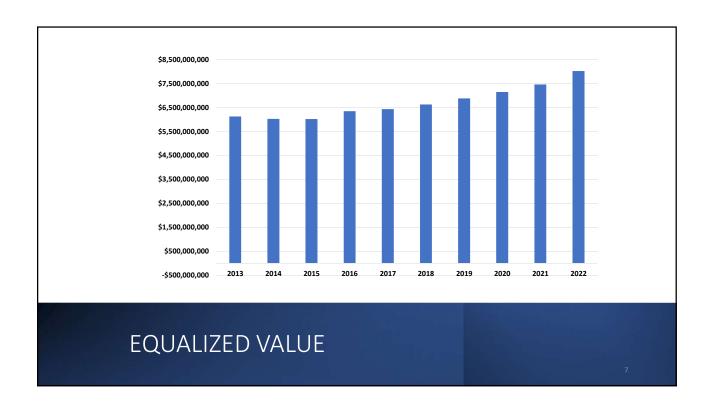

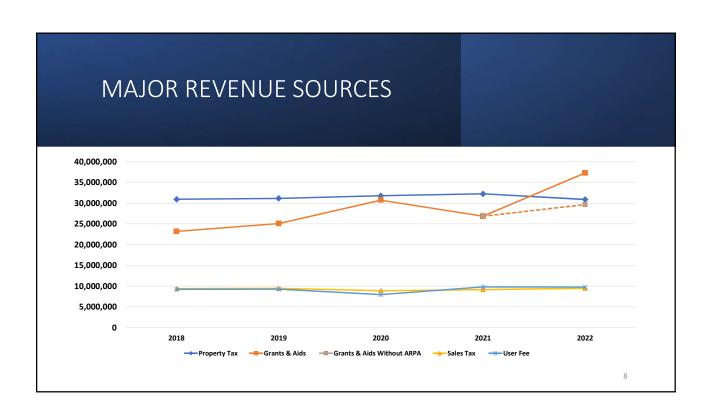
Strategic issues are those fundamental policy choices or critical challenges that must be addressed in order for a community to achieve its vision and mission.

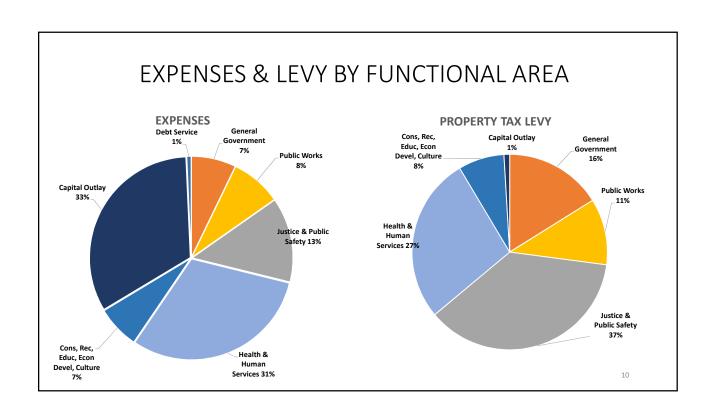

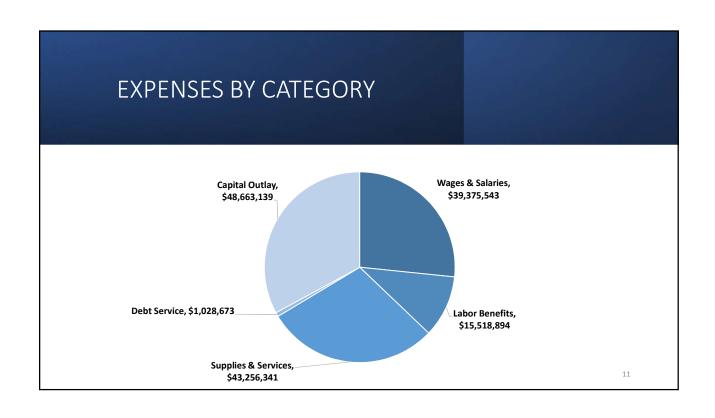

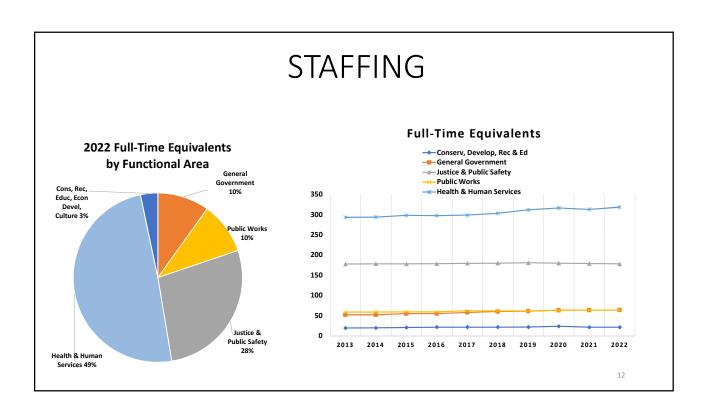

# CONSERVATION, RECREATION, EDUCATION, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & CULTURE

#### **Major Functions**

- -Maintain the 6 county-owned dams
- -Provide technical and monetary assistance for conservation practice installation
- -Campground with 70 units at White Mound Lake, the Great Sauk State Trail, and other county parks/boat landings
- -Educational programming Ag & natural resources; 4-H; family living; community and economic development; tourism; and horticulture
- -Grants for arts and humanities programs

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#### **CAPITAL OUTLAY**

- -\$3,533,664 Facility renovations for enhanced security and better workflow efficiencies
- -\$1,514,221 Tower Road communications tower replacement, radio and other communications upgrades
- -\$600,000 Health Care Center rooftop units
- -\$400,000 UW-Platteville Baraboo/Sauk County theater and arts renovations

## **DEBT SERVICE**

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## 2022 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

Highway shop replacement, estimated \$38,000,000

American Rescue Plan Act funds, \$7,610,495 allocated in 2022 of \$12,517,103 awarded

Law Enforcement Center paid off in 2021, decreasing tax levy \$1,862,000

Decrease interest earned on invested funds, \$474,000

Moderate increase in sales tax of \$326,000, assuming 2020 and 2021 are both anomalies

Loss of state inmate housing revenues, \$237,000

7 new, 13 reclassified, 7 eliminated or reduced positions for an overall tax levy impact of \$275,000

#### GENERAL FUND BALANCE USES

Total Use of General Fund Balance: \$7,776,737

- Facility renovations and security \$3,533,664
- Great Sauk State Trail \$739,635
- Energy cost saving measures \$537,162
- Communications upgrades \$309,029
- Law Enforcement Center video camera upgrades \$220,000
- Vacancy factor \$900,000. Contingency fund \$350,000.
