The population 13 14 of the territory at the time of annexation was zero. 15 The County Board is authorized by Wis. Stat. 59.10(3)(c) to amend its supervisory 16 district plan to reflect an annexation that alters district boundary lines occurring after 17 passage of the 10-Year county redistricting plan in order to administer elections. Said 18 boundary changes are allowed by law if the total number of supervisory districts are left 19 unchanged. This boundary change does not change the number of supervisory districts. 20 The Supervisory District boundary should be amended to reflect this annexation, thereby 21 locating this property from County Supervisory District 13 to County Supervisory 22 District 1. THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF LAKE DELTON, SAUK COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. Petition for Direct Annexation.

A. A petition for Direct Annexation by One Half Approval (the Petition") has been presented to the Village Board of the Village of Lake Delton for the annexation of the following described territory to the Village of Lake Delton, Sauk County, Wisconsin:

- B. The Village Board has reviewed and found the Petition is in compliance with the requirements of s. 66.0217 (3) (a) Wis. Stats.,

It is hereby ordered that the above described property be, and the same is hereby annexed to the Village of Lake Delton, Wisconsin from the Town of Delton, Sauk County, Wisconsin, and it is further ordained that the Village boundaries are amended to include the above described property within the corporate limits of the Village of Lake Delton.

WHEREAS, Village of Lake Delton Ordinance No. 25-036 annexed properties into the Village which are contiguous to the Village and remains a part of the Wisconsin Dells Joint School District No. 1 and the Baraboo Area School District, respectively, Sauk County Supervisor District 13, Wisconsin Assembly District 41; Wisconsin Senate District 14; and U.S Congressional District 2; and

WHEREAS, the annexation would compel the Village to create a Ward 8 with two ballot styles and at present zero (0) voters because of the Supervisory District overlap; and

WHEREAS, Village of Lake Delton Ordinance No. 25-036 annexed properties into the Village is contiguous to Sauk County Supervisor District 1 and Village of Lake Delton Ward 2; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Board of the Village of Lake Delton, meeting in Regular session and requests that the Sauk County Board of Supervisors amend Sauk County Supervisor District 1 to include the annexed territories and to assign the same territory to the Village of Lake Delton's Ward 2 which are contiguous to the Wisconsin Dells Joint School District No. 1 and the Baraboo Area School District, respectively, Wisconsin Assembly District 41; Wisconsin Senate District 14; and U.S Congressional District 2

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon passage this resolution shall become effective on November 15, 2025;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon passage of this Resolution, the Village Clerk, shall transmit a copy to the County Clerk within five days of its adoption and that this Resolution shall remain in effect for each election until modified or rescinded, in accordance with Statute, or until a new division is made following the next federal decennial census if approved by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors.



Resolution to Delegate the Authority to Enter into Settlement Agreements with Opioid Defendants to Designated Sauk County Officer or Officers

Resolution offered by the Executive and Legislative Committee

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:

BACKGROUND: The County Board of Supervisors previously authorized the County to enter into an engagement with von Briesen & Roper, s.c., Crueger Dickinson LLC and Simmons Hanly Conroy LLP (the "Law Firms") to pursue litigation against certain manufacturers, distributors, and retailers of opioid pharmaceuticals (the "Opioid Defendants") in an effort to hold the Opioid Defendants financial responsible for the County's vast expenditure of money and resources to combat the opioid epidemic. On behalf of the County, the Law Firms filed a lawsuit against the Opioid Defendants. The Law Firms filed similar lawsuits on behalf of the 66 other Wisconsin counties and all Wisconsin cases were coordinated with thousands of other lawsuits filed against the same or substantially similar parties a as the Opioid Defendants in the Northern District of Ohio, captioned *In re: Opioid Litigation*, MDL 2804 (the "Litigation). Four (4) additional Wisconsin counties (Milwaukee, Dane, Waukesha, and Walworth Counties) to prepare the County's case for trial and engage in extensive settlement discussions with the Opioid Defendants.

Since the inception of the Litigation, the Law Firms have coordinated with counsel from around the country (including counsel for Milwaukee, Dane, Waukesha, and Walworth Counties) to prepare the County's case for trial and engage in extensive settlement discussions with the Opioid Defendants.

2021 Wisconsin Act 57 created Section 165.12 of the Wisconsin Statues relating to the settlement of all or part of the Litigation. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. 165.12(2), the Legislature's Joint Committee on Finance is required to approve settlement agreement between the County and Opioid Defendants. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. 165.12(2), the proceeds form any settlement of all or part of the Litigation are distributed 70% to local governments in Wisconsin that are parties to the Litigation and 30% to the State. Wis. Stat. 165.12(7) bars claims from any Wisconsin local government against the Opioid Defendants filed after June 1, 2021.

Several of the Opioid Defendants previously agreed to settlement terms with the Plaintiffs' Executive Committee ("PEC"), which is comprised of attorneys' representative of all litigating local governments around the country, subject to individual approval of the litigating local governments including Sauk County. Representatives of the Law Firms serve on the PEC and, therefore, are intimately familiar with the terms of the previous settlements and will be familiar with the terms of any settlement with any other Opioid Defendant recommended for approval by the PEC. It is anticipated that several additional settlements will be proposed by various Opioid Defendants and recommended for approval by the PEC.

Sauk County's process for approving settlement with an Opioid Defendant is typically a process requiring weeks for committee review and approval as well as approval by the full Sauk County Board. Given the concerns surrounding timing for participation in future settlements combined with the number of anticipated settlements, it would be prudent to provide an opportunity for Sauk County to create a process whereby the authority to enter

into settlement agreements is delegated to a responsible County officer or officers provided that any such settlement agreement is recommended by the PEC and the Law Firms.

The intent of this Resolution is to delegate to the specified County officer or officers the authority to enter into settlement agreements with any Opioid Defendant from the date of this Resolution forward provided (a) the settlement is recommended for approval by the PEC and Law Firms; and (b) the Sauk County share of the proceeds from any such settlement is consistent with the shares established in Exhibit A to Addendum Two, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution and which is consistent with the allocations established in previous settlements with Opioid Defendants.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, who met in regular session, hereby makes the following resolutions:

- 1. The County Board hereby delegates authority to the County Administrator/Corporation Counsel to enter into settlement agreement, including without limitation the execution of any and all ancillary documents and agreements necessary to effectuate a settlement, with any Opioid Defendant provided (a) the PEC and Law Firms shall have recommended the settlement; and (b) the Sauk County share of proceeds from any such settlement is consistent with the shares established in Exhibit A to Addendum Two, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution and which is consistent with the allocations established in previous settlements with Opioid Defendants.
- 2. Prior to executing any settlement agreement, or any document related thereto, the County Administrator/Corporation Counsel shall provide notice the County Board Chair of the proposed settlement and the terms related thereto.
- 3. The County Administrator/Corporation Counsel is authorized and directed to take any and all such other and further action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all proceeds from any settlement agreement not otherwise directed to the Attorney Fees Account shall be deposited in the County's Opioid Abatement Account. The Opioid Abatement Account shall be administered consistent with the terms of this Resolution, Wis. Stat. 165.12(4), and the applicable settlement agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County hereby authorizes the establishment of an account separate and distinct from any account containing funds allocated or allowable to the County which shall be referred to by the County as the "Attorney Fees Account." An escrow agent shall deposit a sum equal to up to, but in no event exceeding, an amount equal to 20% of the County's proceeds from a settlement agreement into the Attorney Fees Account unless such other amount is established by the applicable settlement agreement. If the payments to the County are not enough to fully fund the Attorney Fees Account as provided herein because such payments are made over time, the Attorney Fees Account shall be funded by placing up to, but in no event exceeding, an amount equal to 20% of the proceeds from a settlement agreement attributable to Local Governments (as that term is defined in the MOU) into the Attorney Fees Account for each payment. Funds in the Attorney Fees Account shall be utilized to pay the fees, costs, and disbursements owed to the Law Firms pursuant to the engagement agreement between the County and the Law Firms provided, however, the Law Firms shall receive no more than that to which they are entitled under their fee contract when considering the amounts paid the Law Firms from any fee fund established in the settlement agreement and allocable to the County. The Law Firms may make application for payment from the Attorney Fees Account at any time and the County shall cooperate with the Law Firms in executing any documents necessary for the escrow agent to make payments out of the Attorney Fees Account.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE SAUK COUNTY LAND RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT

HE SAUK COUNTY LAND RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT AND THE SAUK SOIL & WATER IMPROVEMENT GROUP

BACKGROUND

To improve water quality in Wisconsin, the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) will provide grants to producer led groups that implement non-point source pollution abatement activities. As part of this grant, the Sauk County Land Resources and Environment (LRE) Department will collaborate with The Sauk Soil & Water Improvement Group (SSWIG) to help support, facilitate, document and communicate soil health and water quality improvements that have occurred because of their effort.

PURPOSE

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes a partnership between the LRE Department (collaborating entity) and SSWIG (Group) as required under s. 93.59, Stats., and Ch. ATCP 52 Wis. Adm. Code for this Producer Led Watershed Protection Grant. This MOU identifies the roles and responsibilities of the County and the Group related to implementation of the producer led watershed protection grant.

MISSION

The County and the Group enter into this MOU to work collaboratively on producer led water quality protection projects in Narrows Creek, Honey Creek, Devil's Lake – Baraboo River, Bear Creek, Spring Green – Wisconsin River, and Otter Creek watersheds to achieve improved soil health and water quality.

The group and County agree as follows:

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The County entity and the Group will work collaboratively to improve soil and water quality within the Narrows Creek, Honey Creek, Devil's Lake – Baraboo River, Bear Creek, Spring Green-Wisconsin River, and Otter Creek watersheds, located in south central Wisconsin. Honey Creek, Otter Creek, Bear Creek, and Narrows Creek are included in the 2024 EPA Impaired Waters list. Impairments include total phosphorus, sediment/total suspended solids, degraded habitat. Lake Wisconsin is also listed due to upstream pollution with possible eutrophication from total phosphorus, according to the DNR. The primary objectives of the grant implementation are to:

- 1) Increase the number of acres that incorporate comprehensive practices that will reduce runoff to surface waters, improve soil health, and improve infiltration on the land.
- 2) Increase knowledge among individuals (farmers, landowners, and residents) within the watersheds about the importance of soil health through on-farm field days, workshops, and events.

- 4) Create and promote economically sound practices that will reduce the amount of nutrient and sediment runoff and improve the soil health.
- 5) Conduct and provide incentive programs for on-farm research and trials for innovative practices and solutions to the complex issues that we are working to address. Farmers completing on-farm research trials will work with UW-Extension, LRE, and Madison Area Technical College (MATC) staff to record the data, create budgets, and share the information with others on field days and other events.
- 6) Provide program assistance and guidance that is not currently available to all Sauk County farmers through existing programs such as EQIP.

These objectives fall in line with objectives identified in the Sauk County Land and Water Resource Management Plan that was approved in 2018.

The County and the group are each responsible for its own expenses related to this MOU except as otherwise provided herein.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The County shall:

- 1) Partner with the group to identify conservation projects and locations within the watersheds.
- 2) Promote DATCP approved conservation practices as well as encourage new/innovative projects that can be evaluated for effectiveness.
- 3) Act as the financial administrator of the grant funding with payments only to those approved by the group.
- 4) Assist the group in fulfilling the reporting requirement of the grant.
- 5) Partner with the group to develop educational programs each year for producers and non-agricultural collaborators.
- 6) Facilitate discussion and partnerships between potential stakeholders and SSWIG to meet their common goals.

The group shall:

- 1) Reach out to other producers in and around the selected watersheds to participate in the conservation efforts.
- 2) Develop the cost share structure and funding distribution for any grant dollars received; including the identification of who, what, and how much funding will be used to meet the goals of the project.
- 3) Partner with the County to develop educational programs each year for producers and non-agricultural collaborators.
- 4) Collaborate with agri-businesses to develop methods to achieve project goals.
- 5) Allow the sharing of information from evaluated practices.

SHARING OF GRANT FUNDS

The funds obtained through this grant will be administered by the Sauk County Land Resources and Environment Department. Payments will be made through vouchers that are approved by the Land Resources and Extension Committee. Funding distribution will be determined by the Sauk Soil & Water Improvement Group.

TERM OF UNDERSTANDING

Unless terminated earlier, as provided below, the term of this MOU is for a period of 3 years from the execution of the MOU and may be extended upon written mutual agreement. It shall be reviewed annually to ensure that it is fulfilling its purpose and to make any necessary revisions.

BACKGROUND:

Sauk County Land Resources and Environment (LRE) Department works closely with the Sauk Soil & Water Improvement Group (SSWIG) to help support, facilitate, document and communicate soil health and water quality improvement projects that are implemented by the group. LRE also acts as a fiscal manager to accept and manage DATCP Producer Led Watershed Protection Grant funds on behalf of SSWIG. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is in place that outlines the objectives and responsibilities of this partnership.

The Sand County Foundation (SCF) is a recipient of a Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) grant allocated by the USDA – Natural Resources Conservation Service. This grant will provide cost share assistance to landowners who implement conservation practices on their land that protect land and water resources. SCF is working with producer led watershed groups throughout Wisconsin to allocate these funds to farmers through subaward agreements. SSWIG has been selected as a subaward recipient and is set to receive \$100,000; however, the funds need to pass through the LRE department as outlined in the MOU. A Cost Reimbursement Award agreement is attached that outlines the terms and conditions of the RCPP grant funds.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, that the County Administrator is hereby authorized to sign the Cost Reimbursement Subaward.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors that the 2025 Budget be amended to increase the Producer Led Watershed Group expenditure funded by the RCPP grant.

Advancing Farmer-Led Incentives in the Midwest

Deliver technical assistance (TA) and financial assistance (FA) to farmers within the Sauk Soil & Water Improvement Group (SSWIG), resulting in NRCS-recognized conservation practices being applied on approximately 2,000 acres directly benefiting at least 20 farmers.

Assign a lead administrative staff person to ensure all invoices, partner contributions, and reporting meets NRCS program requirements. The administrative lead will communicate as needed with SCF staff to ensure timely delivery of these products.

Assign a lead technical staff person to ensure all conservation practice planning, design, and verification documentation meets NRCS practice standards. The technical lead will communicate as needed with SCF staff to ensure timely delivery of these products.

Provide program participant information (Farm entity name, FSA farm and track numbers) to SCF as needed for the NRCS to confirm USDA program eligibility for all participating farmers and properties prior to receiving RCPP financial assistance.

Before practices are applied, complete NRCS CPA-52 Environmental Evaluation Worksheets, Job Sheets, Implementation Requirement forms, or other NRCS documents required for each conservation practice.

Ensure all necessary conservation practice and farm/field data is entered into the CIBO Impact software program. SCF will provide free software access for Sauk County Land Resources and Environment and SSWIG.

After practices are applied, verify and report the extent of applied practices to SCF. Accompany NRCS staff as needed to complete spot checks of installed practices.

For Technical Assistance (TA) expenses, invoice SCF only for actual realized direct costs in accordance with the Valuation Methodology table associated with Supplemental Agreement 2971-A-1586 or amendments thereto as approved by the NRCS. Technical assistance will total no more than \$10,000. Document these costs using the Subawardee TA Payment Request template provided by SCF.

For Financial Assistance (FA) expenses, invoice SCF only for actual realized direct costs in accordance with Supplemental Agreement 2971-A-1639 or amendments thereto as approved by the NRCS. Financial Assistance will total at least \$90,000. Document expenses according to FA payment request templates to be developed in collaboration with SCF to accurately track producer eligibility, FSA farm and tract numbers, and applied units of NRCS conservation practices.

Invoice SCF quarterly at minimum. Financial Assistance expenses will be paid upon verification of practice implementation by the subawardee and spot-checks by the NRCS. Payment from SCF will be delivered no later than 90 days after the invoice is received.

Document at least \$21,892 in cash or in-kind contributions directly related to Farmer-Led Fund activities. Retain records of all partner contributions as necessary to provide to SCF in the event of a project audit by the NRCS.

Provide an annual report of RCPP-supported activities and outcomes within 60 days following the end of each calendar year. Reports will identify all farms/beneficiaries assisted, financial assistance funds expended, conservation practices applied, relevant outreach and education activities delivered, and valuation of partner contributions.

Maintain records of all TA and FA expenses for at least three years after completion of the subaward.

Maintain confidentiality of any personally identifiable information about RCPP program participants, in accordance with Section 1619 requirements of the Farm Bill.

Acknowledge SCF and NRCS assistance in project outreach, media, communications materials, and events supported by RCPP project funds.

SCF and Sauk County Land Resources and Environment will review work plans each year and reserve the right to modify tasks based on project performance and goals.

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GENERAL CODE OF SAUK COUNTY, WISCONSIN ORDINANCE AMENDMENT # 7 2025

Ordinance Amendment to approve a map amendment (rezoning) of lands in the Town of Sumpter from an Agriculture to a Single-Family Residential Zoning District filed upon Sherman and Jeanna Raschein, property owners.

Ordinance Amendment offered by the Land Resources and Extension Committee

BACKGROUND:

Background: Sherman and Jeanna Raschein own property in the NE 1/4, SE 1/4, and NW 1/4, SE 1/4, Section 24, T10N, R6E, Town of Sumpter, and have requested a map amendment (rezoning) of property legally described pursuant to petition 04-2025 from Agriculture to Single Family Residential zoning. The intent of the map amendment (rezoning) is to allow the property to be platted as a subdivision allowing lot sizes of less than one acre.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §59.69(5) Sauk County has the authority to develop, adopt, and amend a zoning ordinance. At a public hearing held by the Land Resources and Extension (LRE) Committee on July 10, 2025; the LRE Committee made findings pursuant to Sauk County Code of Ordinance §7.150(9) and recommended approval of the map amendment.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §66.1001 Wisconsin Statutes, any program or action of a local governmental unit that affects land use shall be consistent with the comprehensive plan. The Sauk County Comprehensive Plan, adopted by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors in 2009, defines managing and focusing "on efficient land use patterns that promotes redevelopment of under-utilized lands. It sets limits on outward growth, incorporates permanent land preservation techniques, and achieves livable communities." Upon evaluation of the request, the Land Resources and Extension Committee found that the rezone request to the Single-Family Residential Zoning District maintains this objective.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SAUK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Any existing ordinances, codes, resolutions, or portions thereof in conflict with this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication as required by law.

Section 3. If any claims, provisions or portions of this ordinance are adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 4. Section 7.005(2) Official Zoning Map of the General Code of Sauk County, Wisconsin, is amended as follows:

Rezone of the approximately 17.88 acres of tax parcels 034-0363-10000 and 034-0352-01000 from an Agriculture Zoning District to a Single-Family Residential Zoning District.
