# RESOLUTION # 77 - 2025

Resolution to Adopt the Sauk County Older Adults Needs Assessment

Resolution offered by the Aging and Disability Resource Center Committee

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On November 14, 2023, during the Sauk County 2024 Budget meeting, there was a motion made by Hazard/Polivka to amend the proposed 2024 budget, as recommended by the finance committee, to fund "a strategic assessment of health care needs in Sauk County". The budget would be amended to fund an overview of the continuum of care in Sauk County for the next 5 to 10 years including the Aging and Disability Resources Center (ADRC), Verteran's Services, Human Services, and Public Health. The Administrator's budget was amended to include \$50,000 of general fund balance for such a plan.

Brent Miller, former County Administrator, requested that Susan Blodgett, former ADRC director, complete a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a continuum of care/needs assessment. In August 2024, an RFP was solicited with a due date of September 13, 2024. In October 2024, the Sauk County Board of Supervisors approved Resolution No. 76-2024 to award the proposal to Dr. Brian Kaskie (Gerontology) from the University of Iowa. His proposal's budget was \$49,010. The final report was to be due December 31, 2024.

Due to changes in administration, the Aging and Disability Resource Center Committee, in February 2025, discussed having Brian Kaskie extend his time through June 2025, to finish the older adults needs assessment. The extension would be at no cost to Sauk County. Administrator Wilson, ADRC Director Susan Blodgett, and other department heads further discussed the draft Older Adults Needs Assessment and requested amendments. After several rounds of discussions and amendments, the final document was prepared and presented to the Aging and Disability Resource Center Committee in October. Upon further review and discussion by the Committee in November, the ADRC Committee is forwarding the final report to the County Board for consideration.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, who met in regular session, hereby adopts the Sauk County Older Adults Needs Assessment.

**BACKGROUND:** The Personnel and Insurance Committee determined Wisconsin County Mutual Insurance Company (WCMIC) provides the most complete coverage for all lines of insurance for 2026, including liability, property, and workers compensation. Therefore, the Personnel and Insurance Committee recommends Wisconsin County Mutual Insurance Corporation (WCMIC) as the most cost-effective proposal for liability, property, and self-insured workers compensation coverage for 2026 as outlined below. \*

Resolution to Award a Contract for the Construction of the White Mound County Park Maintenance Building

Resolution offered by the Land Resources and Extension Committee and Finance, Personnel and Insurance Committee

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:

BACKGROUND: White Mound County Park, Sauk County's signature park, recently underwent a master planning process for the management of the park for the next twenty years. As part of the plan, constructing a new maintenance building is noted as a goal to improve park infrastructure. The existing maintenance building was built in 1998 and was constructed based on the needs of that time. The building is non-compliant with local and state building codes and has become inadequate for operations, equipment storage and staff needs. Jewell Associates from Spring Green, WI was awarded a contract for the design and engineering of the building in June 2024. Bids were let for the construction, with five proposals received by the deadline and evaluated against the criteria in the Request for Bids. A complete list of bids received is attached as Exhibit A.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, met in regular session, that a contract in the amount of \$1,378,862 be awarded to Friede & Associates LLC of Reedsburg, WI for the construction of the White Mound County Park maintenance building; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Sauk County Land Resources and Environment Department is hereby designated as the owner's representative for administration of the contract for the construction of the White Mound County Park maintenance building and is authorized to approve, without further action of the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, change orders not to exceed 10% of the low base bid.

# Resolution to Approve Changes to the Rural Functional Classification System in Sauk County

#### Resolution offered by the Public Works and Infrastructure Committee

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:


BACKGROUND: Functional classification is the method by which roads and streets are categorized based on the levels of mobility and access they provide. Functional classification categories are separate for Urban and Rural areas. Geographic areas not within a designated Urban Area are designated as Rural. Rural areas, for the purposes of functional classification, are defined by county. Functional classification of a road or street has a bearing on federal transportation funding eligibility. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) have developed guidance for functional classification of roads and streets. WisDOT periodically reviews and updates the functional classification system of roads and streets throughout the state. These recommended functional classification changes were developed through joint review by County officials and WisDOT planning staff. Documents showing the recommended functional classifications changes are attached and WisDOT will, after local approval of the recommended functional classifications changes, approve the changes and submit them to FHWA for final approval. The approved final functional classifications map will be made available to Sauk County after FHWA final approval. The new functional classifications will supersede the existing functional classifications in Sauk County;


