ORDINANCE NO. 3 - 2018

AMENDING SAUK CO. CODE CHAPTER 15 TO ADD ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE (ATV) AND UTILITY-TERRAIN VEHICLE (UTV) CROSSINGS AND ROUTES ON COUNTY HIGHWAYS

Background: The State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources has determined that a County Board must approve all ATV/UTV routes individually, and Sauk County has created an Ordinance regulating the uses of All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility-Terrain Vehicles in the County. In order to promote the recreational use of All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility-Terrain Vehicles in, Sauk County designates a limited number of All-Terrain Vehicle and Utility-Terrain Vehicle routes. The Sauk County Highway and Parks Committee receives petitions to designate portions of County Highways as All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility-Terrain Vehicles routes. Sauk Co. Code §15.04(2)(b)6 states that if the Highway and Parks Committee recommends approval of a route or crossing, an ordinance approving the decision shall be prepared for consideration by the County Board. No route or crossing is approved until action of the County Board except that permits for existing routes or crossings may be renewed by the Highway and Parks Committee without further action by the County Board.


DRIVEWAY LOCATION SKETCH





Background: Sauk County provides and staffs a Countywide Emergency Communications Center that receives calls for service for most of Sauk County. The existing communications shelters at the Reedsburg and La Valle tower sites lack space for equipment, in terms of upgrading to future Internet Protocol (IP) channels. All of the equipment used to notify emergency responders of a call for service are housed in the communications shelters at the various tower sites. In preparation for future channel upgrades, the current buildings at Reedsburg and LaValle tower sites need to be replaced. The Communications Technician has located two (2) used communications shelters that will fit the County's needs with future expansion available as well. Delivery and permitting related to shelter installation is included in this project. Other work related to the 2018 capital improvement includes an upgrade to the antenna network and FCC licensing at all the Sauk County tower sites. The Building Services Facilities Director and Communications Technician have been budgeting for this Communications upgrade through the capital improvement process over the last few years. The Sauk County Communications Technician obtained pricing from Towers Direct, TXRX, FCC, ARGUS, and the Sauk County Highway Department for the upgrades at the Communications Tower sites. The total price for upgrades to the County's Communications network in 2018 is not to exceed \$329,380.00. Attached to this resolution is the cost break down for the work to be completed at each communication tower site.

Sauk County Board of Supervisors

RE: Town of Merrimac Zoning Amendments

At a regularly scheduled meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Merrimac, Ordinance 2018-24 adopting amendments to the town's comprehensive plan, and Ordinance 2018-25 amending the town's zoning map, were both adopted unanimously and in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes.

The town has been working with the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection as part of the farmland preservation program since 2016. In each of these plan amendments and rezones, the changes are nothing more than recognizing current and existing uses. These changes are needed to make our maps compliant with the requirements of the DATCP program.

After each property owner was notified 20-days in advance by mail, there were two public hearings regarding the comprehensive plan. One before the zoning commission on January 17, 2018 and the other before the town board on February 7, 2018. A public hearing regarding the zoning amendments was also held on January 17th. The commission made changes to both ordinances that were approved at the February 21, 2017 meeting and subsequently approved by the town board on March 7, 2018.

At the December meeting of the Sauk County Board of Supervisors there seemed to be considerable concern regarding another property, a rezoning matter that was not before the county supervisors for consideration that evening. The matter in question was eventually tabled at the January 17, 2018 zoning commission meeting after 8 open meetings over an 11 month period and 3 public hearings, all of which were well attended by adjacent property owners. The rezone of the property in question is also not in this packet for your consideration at this time.

The Town of Merrimac has been responsible for its zoning for 25 years after our ordinance became effective on January 19, 1993. It is a process that is guided by state law and involves 8 resident members of the planning commission, a 3-member town board, a professional planner from VanderWalle & Associates, and as many as 3 attorneys as the need may arise.

The process is one that can give you confidence that any amendment placed before you for consideration has been thoroughly vetted by a strong team of persons who serve their community just as you serve our county.





Background: Sauk County owns approximately 259 acres of tillable land, known as the Sauk County Farm in Sections 27, 28, 33, and 34, town of Reedsburg, located adjacent to the former Sauk County Health Care Center. The Sauk County Farm is utilized as a demonstration site to showcase new and innovative conservation practices that prevent soil erosion and reduce agricultural runoff to protect groundwater and surface water resources. In May of 2017, several buildings were destroyed by storm damage at the Sauk County Farm and an insurance claim was filed. In October of 2017, the Department initiated a bid request to provide for the demolition, hauling and recycling services of structures/materials located at the Sauk County Farm, as well as regrading and seeding of disturbed areas. Additional services that required consideration included site analysis, environmental impacts and knowledge of clean fill standards. The Department did not receive any responsive bids that met the criteria as specified in the bid packet. In November of 2017, the Sauk County Highway Commissioner met with the Conservation, Planning and Zoning Committee and determined that the work that was required in the original bid request could be fulfilled by the Sauk County Highway Department for reasonable costs, consistent with the mission of the Department and the continued conservation efforts at the Sauk County Farm. Estimated costs to burn any non-painted wood, dispose of any other trash or materials at the dump, burial of any concrete, and grading/seeding of the areas is estimated at \$33,000.

RESOLUTION NO. 64 - 2018

APPROVING A CONTRACT WITH HOPE HOUSE FOR CHILD AND FAMILY ADVOCACY SERVICES

Background: In 2016, Sauk County funded \$50,000 in order to re-start a Court Assisted Special Advocate ("CASA") program for Sauk County. Hope House administered the program. CASA is a national program that provides court advocacy for abused or neglected children as they navigate the court process. As Hope House worked to build the program, it encountered several issues with operating the program in Sauk County. Hope House ultimately decided it no longer wished to continue to administer the program. However, it still wanted to be involved in advocacy services for Sauk County. In discussing the needs of Sauk County with Human Services, Corporation Counsel, the Register in Probate, the Courts, and Hope House, we realized that the CASA goals could also be realized through other needed services. Hope House has offered to provide a needs study to determine the scale of child advocacy that is feasible and needed in Sauk County. In addition, they wish to work with Human Services to provide advocacy services to Sauk County children and families that do not meet the requirements for services provided by Human Services. This would be a community response program that is administered at the County level, but independent of Sauk County Human Services. Community Response programs are recognized by the state and national prevention organizations as needed and beneficial services. The goals include establishment of comprehensive voluntary services for diverted programs, building a more comprehensive, community based response, reduce reports to Child Protective Services by reducing risk factors and increasing preventative factors, and reach families prior to a crisis.

The purpose of this resolution is to authorize a contract with Hope House to provide a needs assessment and child and family advocacy services using the \$50,000 budgeted for the CASA program.

The public shall have the afternoon from noon to 4:30 on both dates, at the respective facilities, to transact any business. The benefits to the safety of county employees and the public from conducting these drills outweighs any inconvenience to the public convenience and necessity.

Hill's Wiring then removed the temporary wiring after the radiator was repaired and replaced on the roof of the Law Enforcement Center.
