Criminal Justice Coordinating Council - Annual Report

2018 Mission:

The Sauk County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council will use data-driven, evidence-based practices to inform decision making and will examine and respond to the root cause of crime, in an effort to reduce crime, create a safer community, and provide effective treatment for individuals and families involved in the Sauk County Criminal Justice System. The CJCC will improve communication between participating agencies and use a collaborative approach to respond to criminal conduct and to provide coordinated care.

Departmental Program Summary:

CJCC is a division of the Administration Department which offered two programs in 2018. Additional initiatives were explored and evaluated for implementation and system improvement. CJCC staff also attend committees and community events led by other departments/groups for collaboration and service improvement.

Adult Treatment Court – a post-conviction diversion program for Sauk County, adult residents with substance use disorders. It is an intensive five phase program that requires a minimum of 14 months to complete. Regular court appearances, random substance use testing, treatment, support meetings, employment/community service, budget development, compliance with probation rules, and case management are required.

Substance Use Diversion & Support – a pre-booking diversion program for Sauk County, adult residents with substance use disorders. Individuals may be referred through social contact (no criminal arrestable criminal activity) or through law enforcement referral for non-violent criminal offenses. The program is a minimum of four months and maximum of six. Intensity of case management and wrap around services is based on individual circumstances and risk. Risk is determined by the proxy. This is a pilot program scheduled to end on 12/31/19.
