<u>Changes / Accomplishments:</u> 2013 was a pivotal year for the health care center with changes in two key department managers. Transition of new leadership in these departments has lead to new efficiencies and changes in programs. We have also had changes in our infection control requirements and saw an increase in quarantines due to influenza and noro virus symptoms. As we continue to adapt to the changes with the decertification of the union, we will strive for creative ways to control expenses.

Statistical Summary: In 2013 we had 112 admissions and 111 discharges mainly from Sauk County with our largest referral base being the Reedsburg Area Medical Group, St. Clare Hospital and Sauk Prairie Hospital.
