

Resolution No 5-11

Authorization to Proceed with Contract to Form and Join Income Maintenance Administration Consortium

WHEREAS, under current law, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 49.78, the State Department of Health Services ("DHS") has delegated certain duties and responsibilities related to the administration of the Income Maintenance program to counties; and

WHEREAS, under current law, Wis. Stats. §§ 46.031 and 49.78 require Sauk County to enter into a contract with DHS for the provision of Income Maintenance program administration services; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Governor's budget proposal for the 2011-13 biennium, 2011 Assembly Bill 40, the Governor proposed that starting in calendar year 2012, responsibility for administration of the Income Maintenance program be transferred from counties to DHS; and

WHEREAS, counties across Wisconsin registered objections to the Governor's proposal and offered an alternative whereby counties would work cooperatively in creating regional consortia, which would be responsible for Income Maintenance program administration services; and

WHEREAS, the counties offered the Legislature an alternative to the Governor's complete DHS takeover of Income Maintenance program administration, which proposal allowed, among other things, for the creation of consortia over the course of the 2011-13 biennium and a gradual phase-in of consortia-based contracts to replace the individual county contracts for Income Maintenance program administration; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature's Joint Committee on Finance accepted the counties' alternative proposal, in part, and rejected the complete DHS takeover of Income Maintenance program administration services; and

WHEREAS, 2011 Wisconsin Act 32, the Biennial Budget Bill, modifies current law relating to the authorization for DHS to enter into contracts with individual counties in relation to Income Maintenance program administration services and instead authorizes the formation of county-based regional consortia and further authorizes the consortia to enter into a contract with DHS related to the provision of the services; and

WHEREAS, Act 32 specifically provides that "... each county with a population of less than 750,000 shall participate in a multicounty consortium that is approved by the department..." and further that "... [b]y October 31, 2011, the department shall approve multicounty consortia...;" and

WHEREAS, Act 32 further provides that "[t]he department may not approve more than 10 multicounty consortia. . .;" and

WHEREAS, Act 32 further provides that "[i]f a county with a population of less than 750,000 does not participate in a multicounty consortium or the department determines that a multicounty consortium does not satisfy the department's performance requirements, the department shall assume responsibility for administering income maintenance programs in that county or in the geographical area of the multicounty consortium. . .;" and

WHEREAS, Act 32 further provides that, without regard to whether a county chooses to allow DHS to take over Income Maintenance program administration services or join a consortium that will provide the services, Sauk County is required to maintain a tax levy contribution to the system at an amount not less than the amount contributed in 2009; and

WHEREAS, as a result of Act 32, Sauk County is faced with a choice of either fully relinquishing all responsibility for Income Maintenance program administration services to DHS or joining a multi-county consortium consistent with the requirements established in Act 32; and

WHEREAS, Sauk County believes it to be in the best interests of the citizens and employees of Sauk County to join a multi-county consortium related to the provision of Income Maintenance program administration services consistent with the requirements established in Act 32; and

WHEREAS, joining a multi-county consortium for purposes of the provision of Income Maintenance program administration services will require that Sauk County enter into a contract or series of contracts with the other counties that make up the consortium and continue to provide 2011 staffing levels and 2011 county tax levy amounts; and

WHEREAS, the contracts with other counties will establish, among other things, the following: (1) financial responsibility for the consortium; (2) financial accountability among consortium members; (3) individual county responsibilities related to the provision of services; (4) methods for service level accountability among consortium members; and (5) overall responsibility for the contract that will be entered into by and among the multi-county consortium and DHS; and

WHEREAS, the intent of this Resolution is to authorize the Sauk County Human Services Director to enter into any and all contracts or other documents necessary to create, form, authorize and/or operate the multi-county consortium of which Sauk County will be a member; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution shall be interpreted liberally in favor of authorizing the Human Services Director to take all actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, that:

- 1. Sauk County does declare its intent to join a multi-county consortium consistent with the requirements set forth in Act 32.
- 2. Sauk County hereby authorizes its Human Services Director to enter into any and all contracts or other documents necessary to create, form, authorize and/or operate the multi-county consortium of which Sauk County will be a member.
- 3. Sauk County hereby authorizes its Human Services Director to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this Resolution.

We estimate that the Federal Match would be around \$100,000 which would then reduce our County Levy contribution to \$100,000. The Federal Match is achieved by Sauk County Human Services claiming additional dollars above our initial allocation based on the amount of time the Income Maintenance staff spent working in that program. If there was no additional claim above our initial allocation, we would receive no Federal Match.

WHEREAS, under the Dean Health Plan contract language, regulated by the Insurance Commissioner, the employer contributions cannot be less than 50% for single and 40% for family coverage for each employee; and

WHEREAS, the Personnel Committee has reviewed the proposals submitted for the 2012 coverage by Dean Health Plan consisting of an HMO, a \$15 co-pay HMO and a Point of Enrollment, offering rates as follows:

Conversely, if claims exceeded 120% of premiums paid, the County would have to pay up to an additional 3% (\$216,760) of overall health insurance premiums to Dean Health Plan. Petition # 4-2011 Proposed Resource Conservancy-35 Rezone by the Town of Excelsior, Joe Fish, Town Chair.

Public Hearing Scheduled for: August 23, 2011

1. Request

A request was submitted by the Town of Excelsior to change the zoning of property from a Resource Conservancy-5 to a Resource Conservancy-35 Zoning District. The purpose or basis of the rezone request, as stated by the applicant, is to establish a land use zoning program that reflects the vision and objectives of the Town of Excelsior's Comprehensive Plan. The land to be affected by the proposed rezone is noted in Appendix A on a map entitled, "Proposed Excelsior RC-35 Rezone," dated August 23, 2011. Also, please see Appendix B for a copy of a Town ordinance adopting an amendment to the Town of Excelsior Comprehensive Plan and which recognizes Resource Conservancy-35 Zoning.

2. History/Information

Background Information

March 31, 2009. The Town of Excelsior Town Board adopted the Town of Excelsior Comprehensive Plan. The following Land Use Goal excerpted from this plan pertains to the Town's rezone request:

"Plan, control and manage development that will continue to foster a sense of community, and that will preserve the country flavor of the Township while maintaining a balance among agriculture, natural resources, quality of life and development."

Early 2011. The Town of Excelsior convened a committee composed of town residents to discuss and recommend to the Town Board a zoning program that best reflects the vision, goals and objectives in the Town's Comprehensive Plan. Utilizing a qualified consensus process, the Committee decided and recommended that the Town adopt Exclusive Agricultural zoning. Sauk County Planning & Zoning staff provided periodic technical assistance to the Committee regarding the differences between zoning options for consideration by the Committee.

July 12, 2011. The Town of Excelsior Town Board amended the Town of Excelsior Comprehensive Plan to correct errors and clarify programs. The Plan was also amended to include objectives and policies that relate to the rezone request. Also on July 12, 2011, the Town Board recommended approval of the Resource Conservancy-35 Zoning District. Please see Appendix C for a copy of the Town Board minutes reflecting the approval of Resource Conservancy-35 Zoning District. The policies and objectives from the *Plan* that support the rezone are as follows:

LU-Objective-12 Manage the creation of new lots for residential development.


LU-Policy-12a Replace the Resource Conservancy – 5 Zoning District with the Resource Conservancy – 35 Zoning District which will serve as a transitional zoning to the Exclusive Agricultural Zoning District. The transition to Exclusive Agriculture will occur after an updated Exclusive Agricultural Zoning District has been certified by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) to meet the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 91 and which has been approved by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors. Following certification and approval, the town will file an application with Sauk County to apply Exclusive Agricultural Zoning to all areas zoned Resource Conservancy-35.

LU-Policy-12b. The Town of Excelsior will utilize the Sauk County Planned Unit Development Program and intends to follow minimum standards set forth in the Sauk County Zoning Ordinance with regard to density, lot size, and sighting requirements.

July 19, 2011. A complete rezone application was received by the Sauk County Conservation, Planning and Zoning Department.

3. Summary

In summary, the Town of Excelsior Town Board commissioned a committee of town residents to recommend updates to the Town of Excelsior Comprehensive Plan and to consider a zoning program that reflects the goals, objectives and policies of this *Plan*. The Committee recommended to the Town of Excelsior Board the adoption of Exclusive Agricultural Zoning with Resource Conservancy-35 zoning to serve as an interim zoning district until such time that DATCP certifies an updated Exclusive Agricultural Zoning ordinance that meets the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 91. The Town of Excelsior Town Board has subsequently approved a rezone of the Town from the Resource Conservancy-5 to the Resource Conservancy-35 Zoning District.




