WHEREAS, the Sauk County Mapping and Land Information Department maintains the Sauk County Geographic Information System, and;

WHEREAS, the purpose of the system is to provide accurate and current records related to the geography of Sauk County for public and private uses, and;

WHEREAS, the current system software and architecture is cumbersome to maintain and prone to outages, and;

WHERSAS, ongoing issues with the current system and the processes which support this system have been researched, and;

WHEREAS, the migration to ArcGIS Server would improve reliability and facilitate departmental maintenance of spatial information, and;

WHEREAS, the proposed project is to be funded with Land Records Modernization funds, which are comprised of fees retained from document filings in the Register of Deeds Department to be used to improve Sauk County's Land Records System, and;

WHEREAS, your Executive and Legislative and Planning, Zoning and Land Records Committees have reviewed this matter and found it in the best interest of Sauk County to accept the following proposal:

ESRI ArcGIS Software and Services: \$39,250

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, met in regular session, that the purchase of ESRI ArcGIS Server Software and related services from ESRI is hereby approved, and,

AMENDING THE 2011 BUDGET TO ACCEPT A CDBG-EAP GRANT TO ASSIST IN BUSINESS MITIGATION AND LIDAR DATA COLLECTION

WHEREAS, December 2010 Resolution 134-10 approved the preparation of an application for funds from the Wisconsin Department of Commerce, Wisconsin Small Cities Community Development Block Grant - Emergency Assistance Program; and,

WHEREAS, Sauk County has received notice of an award of \$526,000 to assist in business mitigation activities to benefit Lakeside Foods and surrounding businesses, and \$342,000 in funding for LiDAR (Light Detection And Ranging) data collection in support of floodplain mapping activities; and,

WHEREAS, mitigation of flood prone areas is essential for preparing for potential future flood events; and,

WHEREAS, installation of a levee along the Baraboo River in Reedsburg adjacent to the Lakeside Foods facility will provide protection for Lakeside Foods and four other businesses located along the Baraboo River that in total provide 47 full time jobs and 201 part-time jobs; and,

WHEREAS, Sauk County through the Wisconsin Regional Orthophotography Consortium made application for funds to acquire elevation data; and,

WHEREAS, collection of LiDAR data in combination with updated orthophotography will provide information that will inform development, and allow for avoidance of flood prone areas; and,

WHEREAS, in September of 2009, Resolution 123-09 authorized Sauk County to contract with Ayres Associates for the acquisition of County-wide orthophotography through the Wisconsin Regional Orthophotography Consortium, a multi-county initiative for the acquisition of this data; and,

WHEREAS, the Land Information Department has entered into a contract with Ayres Associates for the acquisition of Orthophotography; and,

WHEREAS, this contract also covers the acquisition of this LiDAR data, pending grant approval, and meets the Wisconsin Department of Commerce requirement and County requirement for a competitive bid process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors met in regular session that the 2011 budget be amended to include the \$526,000 to assist in business mitigation activities to benefit Lakeside Foods, and \$342,000 in funding for LiDAR data collection in support of floodplain mapping activities.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Management Information Systems Coordinator and the Administrative Coordinator are hereby delegated the authority to amend the existing contract with Ayres Associates for the acquisition of the LiDAR data.

WHEREAS, Sauk County presently maintains a 147.98 mile fiber optic loop around Sauk County; and,

WHEREAS, the fiber optic loop is utilized to deliver the Sauk County computer network to most of the County facilities; and,

WHEREAS, the Highway Department located on Highway 136 in West Baraboo is still operating on leased DS-1 Circuits for computer and phone system connectivity back to the county network; and,

WHEREAS, the bandwidth of the current DS-1 Circuit connection is inadequate to service the applications currently in use at the Highway Department creating difficulty in utilizing centralized County applications and making it impossible to use specialized computer programs hosted by the State; and,

WHEREAS, in order to reduce the performance issues of the existing leased services, Sauk County will be required to lease additional bandwidth from the circuit provider or provide a County owned fiber network solution; and,

WHEREAS, the Communications Infrastructure Committee directed the Emergency Management, Buildings and Safety Administrator and Communications Technician to obtain cost estimates for various plans to run fiber to the Highway Department; and,

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management, Buildings and Safety Administrator and Communications Technician obtained estimates to run fiber to the Highway Department with the assistance from our County Fiber Engineer, Lightwave Networks LLC, as well as prices for upgrading the DS-1 Circuit to a higher speed Ethernet circuit; and,

WHEREAS, if the fiber is installed the County would be able to disconnect a number of existing services and save approximately \$9,048 annually; and,

WHEREAS, your Communications Infrastructure Committee, Property and Insurance Committee and Highway and Parks Committee after careful consideration, believe it is in the best interest of Sauk County to move forward with the installation of fiber optic cable to the Highway; and,
