#### Zoning Map Amendment Procedures and Requirements

At the public hearing, the applicant may appear in person or through an agent or an attorney of their choice. The applicant/agent/attorney may present testimony, evidence and arguments in support of the application. All site plans, pictures, etc. become the property of the Land Resources & Environment Department, will remain in the file, and will be public record.

#### What is a Zoning Map Amendment?

The purpose of a zoning map amendment is to alter, enlarge, or reduce a geographic extent of any zoning district, or to enact a new zoning designation for any particular parcel or real property. A change in zoning allows for different land uses and in some instances, different densities of development. The Land Resources & Environment Committee will recommend approval or disapproval of a rezone to the Sauk County Board of Supervisors in accordance with the standards and criteria set by the zoning ordinance.

### Standards and Criteria

In reviewing a Zoning Map Amendment request, the LRE Committee must follow four standards:

- a)...The proposed map amendment is consistent with the overall purpose and intent of the zoning ordinance.
- b) The proposed map amendment is consistent with the Sauk County Comprehensive Plan and the Farmland Preservation Plan, if applicable.
- c) Factors have changed from the time of initial ordinance adoption that warrant the map change, or an error, inconsistency, or technical problem administering the zoning ordinance as currently depicted has been observed.
- d) in rezoning land out of any exclusive agriculture district, the agency shall find all of the following, after a public
  - The land is better suited for a use not allowed in the exclusive agriculture district.
  - 2. The rezoning is consistent with the Sauk County Comprehensive Plan.
  - 3. The rezoning is substantially consistent with the Sauk County Farmland Preservation Plan.
  - 4. The rezoning will not substantially impair or limit current or future agricultural use of surrounding parcels of land that are zoned for or legally restricted to agricultural use.

Note: Pursuant to Wis, Stat § 91.48(1) A political subdivision (Sauk County) with a certified farmland preservation zoning ordinance may not rezone land out of a farmland preservation zoning district (Exclusive Agriculture) without having the rezoning certified under Wis, Stat § 91.36 and provided that the standards (a) through (d) above are met.

#### Process

- 1. Contact the LRE Department to schedule a meeting to review your potential request.
- Complete the Zoning Map Amendment Application and provide all the supplemental items to the LRE Department by the filing deadline.
- 3. Review such application with the appropriate staff member to determine completeness.
- 4. If the application is complete, LRE staff will publish notice of your request for a zoning map amendment in the County's official newspaper noting the location and time of the required public hearing before the LRE Committee. Neighbors, town officials, and affected state agencies will be notified as well.
- 5. If the Town choses to review the zoning map amendment request at the Town Planning Commission and Town. Board level, you will need to attend such meetings to provide information regarding the request. Please request that copies of minutes/proceedings outlining the Town's recommendation be provided to the LRE Department for the file.
- 6. A public hearing will be held before the LRE Committee. Either the property owner or designated agent will need to be present at the hearing to provide testimony regarding the request. The LRE Committee must make a decision based only on the evidence that is submitted to it at the time of the hearing. Failure to provide representation may result in demal or postponement of your request.
- The LRB Committee and Sauk County Board of Supervisors may approve, disapprove, or modify and approve the zoning map amendment request.

Please Note: If a zoning map amendment application is dis approved by the LRE Committee and no appeal is filed, no new zoning map amendment application can be re-submitted for a period of 365 days from the date of the LRE Committee's decision, except on grounds of new evidence or proof of changes of factors found valid by the LRE Committee.



Town of Greenfield Board Meeting Greenfield Town Hall 7 p.m., Tuesday, December 14, 2021

Chairman Terry Turnquist called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Present: Turnquist and Supervisors Fred Coller and John Geoghegan, Treasurer Bob Geenen, Clerk Mary Friesen, and four additional residents.

Verification of Notices was made.

Agenda was approved on a motion by Geoghegan and a second by Coller.

Minutes of the November meeting were approved on a motion by Coller and a second by Geoghegan.

The Treasurer's report with a balance of \$486,382.54 was approved on a motion by Geoghegan and a second by Coller.

Approval of bills was made in the amount of \$9,724.75 on a motion by Coller and a second by Geoghegan.

Public Comment - None.

The Board approved making a recommendation to the Sauk County Land Resources & Environmental Committee to rezone a property at S5390 State Road 113 from RC 35 to Commercial on a motion by Turnquist and a second by Coller.

The Board approved a recommendation by the Plan Commission for a Conditional Use Permit for a lodging house for Micelle Gillette at S5390 State Road 113 on a motion by Geoghegan and a second by Coller.

The Board gave preliminary approval for the draft of an Ordinance for Short Term Rental Property with suggested modifications by members, on a motion by Turnquist and a second by Coller. An updated copy of the Ordinance will be published with the intent of holding a Public Hearing at 7 p.m., Tuesday, January 11, 2022.

A three-year renewal of the Assessor Contract was approved for Holloway Appraisal, on a motion by Turnquist and a second by Geoghegan. There will be no changes to the new contract.



### RESOLUTION # 55 - 2022

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE ADRC TO PURCHASE A HANDICAPPED ACCESSIBLE VAN FOR THE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM USING DOT TRUST FUND AND AMENDING THE 2022 BUDGET FOR THIS PURPOSE

Resolution offered by the Aging and Disability Resources and Veterans Service Office Committee

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:

#### BACKGROUND:

The Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC) provides needed transportation to the elderly and disabled clients through two Department of Transportation (DOT) grants. Many clients are not ambulatory and must have a vehicle that will accommodate a wheelchair, motorized wheelchair, and/or scooter. The ADRC has buses that accommodate such riders, but it is more cost effective to transport such clients in a van.

The ADRC currently has \$66,610.75 in its DOT Trust fund account. The Trust fund is to be used to purchase or maintain vehicles for the ADRC's transportation program. The State Department of Transportation does not allow the ADRC to have more than \$80,000.00 in the fund at any one time; any funds over \$80,000.00 must be returned to the state.

In the 2022 budget, the ADRC anticipated purchasing a handicap accessible van in 2025. However, with the cost of vehicles increasing and more limited availability (Dodge no longer makes a Caravan), the ADRC would like to purchase another vehicle to meet the over 100 requests for rides a week. A& J Vans has a 2021 Chrysler Voyager for \$35,030 after a \$1,000 discount. The package from BraunAbility that modifies the vehicle into a rear entry handicap accessible van is \$21,995. Title and license fee is \$169.50, for a total of \$57,194.50. Currently there are not any passenger vans available through the state contract. The ADRC Director has called several Chrysler locations and the least expensive Voyager was \$48,000, before the BraunAbility package is added.

The state has given permission to use the trust fund to purchase the vehicle, if approved by the County Board. Once the trust fund is reduced to less than \$9,500, Sauk County will be better positioned to apply for a new bus from the 53.10 grant due in August. The handicapped accessible vehicle will be purchased with DOT trust funds; no levy dollars will be used.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, met in regular session, that Sauk County is hereby authorized to purchase the rear-entry handicapped accessible van from A&J Vans at a cost of 57,194.50 using DOT trust funds; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, that the 2022 ADRC budget be amended to appropriate \$57,195 of the ADRC's DOT trust fund.

The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide a substantial infusion of resources to help turn the tide on the pandemic, address its economic fallout, and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery.

The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide substantial flexibility for each government to meet local needs—including support for households, small businesses, impacted industries, essential workers, and the communities hardest hit by the crisis. These funds can also be used to make necessary investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure.

This broadband access grant, through a public/private partnership agreement Wisconsin State Statute § 196.504, seeks to help provide access to broadband services through River Valley Commons (RVC) in unserved and/or underserved areas to encourage economic development assisting the River Valley School District (RVSD) within its geographic area by providing direction and guidance to municipalities in that area for broadband opportunities.

#### BACKGROUND:

§34.05 of the Wisconsin Statutes provides for the designation of official County depositories and the specification by County Boards of Supervisors of the basis upon which Treasurers shall be authorized to deposit and invest funds. The Sauk County Finance Committee has reviewed these and other financial matters and, in light of past practice and the best interest of Sauk County, does make the following recommendations as outlined in the resolution.

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors, met in regular session, that the Sauk County Treasurer shall deposit County funds as provided under the statutes of the State of Wisconsin, County Financial Policy 10-95, and this resolution, emphasizing preservation of principal, liquidity and rate of return; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that Sauk County participate in the State of Wisconsin's Local Government Investment Pool pursuant to §25.50 of the Wisconsin Statutes, with the Sauk County Treasurer or authorized deputies hereby designated as the "local official" authorized to invest County monies in this fund and to make withdrawals therefrom as required; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Sauk County Treasurer shall be authorized to maintain a working or active checking account for the immediate operation of Sauk County in any financial institution that is a member of Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and under the State of Wisconsin deposit guarantee program if applicable. The financial institution must be conveniently located for conducting daily business; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to §34.09 of the Wisconsin Statutes, every federal or state credit union, state bank, federal or state savings and loan association, savings and trust company and federal or state savings bank and every national bank may be designated as a public depository and may receive and hold public deposits, subject to the referenced chapter, if the financial institution has a branch or main office located in this state, complies with this chapter with respect to public deposits and accepts payments made by the state under §16.412 of the Wisconsin Statutes; and,



UTILITY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EASEMENT AND TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS UTILITY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS EASEMENT AND TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is granted by Sauk County ("Grantor") to Reedsburg Utility Commission ("Grantee").

#### RECITALS:

- A. Grantor is the fee holder of certain real property in the Village of West Baraboo, Sauk County, State of Wisconsin, as shown on attached Exhibit A, fully incorporated herein ("the *Property*"), being located at Tax Parcel Identification #191-0072-00000 and #191-0086-00000.
- B. Grantee requested that Grantor grant a permanent easement and temporary construction easement ("the *Easement*") over certain portions of the Property as described and depicted on attached **Exhibit A**, fully incorporated herein. This being the Utility and Telecommunications Easement Area ("*Easement Area*").

#### **AGREEMENT**

For good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1. Grant of Easement.

a. Grantor hereby grants, gives, and conveys to Grantee, its successor and assigns, and Grantee's contractors and agents, the perpetual right, privilege, right-of-way, easement and authority for ingress and egress over, upon, and across the Easement Area to survey,

construct (including but not limited to an approximate 12' x 8' Telecommunications Fiber Optic/Utility Building), reconstruct, use, operate, patrol, maintain, test, inspect, repair, replace, alter, remove or replace or abandon (said activities hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Installation") of any existing and future utilities, including but not limited to electrical and fiber optic infrastructure, lines, cables, and connections and any appurtenances and equipment related thereto (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Grantee's Utility").

b. Improvements in the Easement Area shall be located above and below grade, including, but not limited to, an approximate 12' x 8' Telecommunications Fiber Optic/Utility Building, cable, lines and telecommunication boxes that extend up to and beyond grade surface. No above ground objects or features will be placed in the area identified on Exhibits A as "Sauk County Highway Department [Private Access] One Way", also known as "Your Way Lane" that is approximately thirty (30) feet wide running from Highway BD south and across the Property to Highway 136, collectively referred to ("Private Access").

# 2. Grant of Temporary Construction Easement.

- a. Grantor hereby further grants to Grantee, its successors and assigns (and for the use of its agents, employees, contractors, licensees, and invitees), a temporary construction easement for the Installation of Grantee's Utility (the "Temporary Construction Easement"), in and on the Easement Area.
- b. No above ground objects or features shall be placed in the Private Access. The Temporary Construction Easement shall be used by the Grantee only during periods of installation, keeping, maintaining, and for any necessary restoration of the Grantee's Utilities.
- 3. Access to Easement Area. Grantor grants to Grantee, its successors and assigns, access to the Easement Area for ingress and egress over, upon, and across Private Access during the term of the easements.
- 4. Indemnification. Grantee shall indemnify Grantor from and against all loss, costs (including reasonable attorney fees), injury, death, or damage to persons or property that at any time during the term of this Agreement may be suffered or sustained by any person or entity in connection with Grantee's activities conducted on the Property, regardless of the cause of the injury, except to the extent caused by the gross negligence or misconduct of Grantor or its agents or employees.
- 5. Consistent Uses Allowed. Grantor reserves the right to use the Easement for purposes that will not interfere with Grantee's full enjoyment of the Easement rights granted in this Agreement.
- 6. Restoration of Surface. Grantee shall restore the surface disturbed by any construction or maintenance of any equipment located within the Easement to its condition before the disturbance.
- 7. Covenants Run with Land. All terms and conditions in this Agreement, including the benefits and burdens, shall run with the land and shall be binding upon, inure to the benefit of, and be enforceable by Grantor and Grantee and their respective successors and assigns. The party named as Grantor in this Agreement and any successor or assign to Grantor as fee simple owner of the Property shall cease to have any liability under this Agreement with respect to facts or circumstances arising after the party has transferred its fee simple interest in the Property.

- Non-Use. Non-use or limited use of the Easement rights granted in this Agreement shall 8. not prevent the benefiting party from later use of the Easement rights to the fullest extent authorized in this Agreement.
- Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.
- Entire Agreement. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding of the parties and may not be changed except by a written document executed and acknowledged by all parties to this Agreement and duly recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Sauk County, Wisconsin.
- Notices. All notices to either party to this Agreement shall be delivered in person or sent 11. by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, to the other party at that party's last known address. If the other party's address is not known to the party desiring to send a notice, the party sending the notice may use the address to which the other party's property tax bills are sent. Either party may change its address for notice by providing written notice to the other party.
- Invalidity. If any term or condition of this Agreement, or the application of this Agreement to any person or circumstance, shall be deemed invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of the term or condition to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term and condition shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- Waiver. No delay or omission by any party in exercising any right or power arising out 13. of any default under any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement shall be construed to be a waiver of the right or power. A waiver by a party of any of the obligations of the other party shall not be construed to be a waiver of any breach of any other terms or conditions of this Agreement.
- Enforcement. Enforcement of this Agreement may be by proceedings at law or in equity 14. against any person or persons violating or attempting or threatening to violate any term or condition in this Agreement, either to restrain or prevent the violation or to obtain any other relief. If a suit is brought to enforce this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its costs, including reasonable attorney fees, from the non-prevailing party.
- No Public Dedication. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed a gift or dedication of 15. any portion of the easements granted under this Agreement to the general public or for any public purpose whatsoever.


