Discover Wisconsin will produce and air one television episode featuring Sauk County on traditional television, YouTube and Over The Top (OTT) placement over the course of two fiscal years (2023 and 2024) with first airing in Fall 2023. Additional brand relevant components will be promotion of the production across all DW social media platforms for an estimated exposure of 350,000-500,000 impressions; one blog highlighting the piece; three e-newsletter features for the show; one traditional news release across all Wisconsin media outlets; show premier and discussion segment on podcasts; events calendar, use of logos and episode segments edited for placement on YouTube. Total cost is \$50,000 with a budget amendment for \$25,000 in 2023 and the balance to be included in the 2024 budget.



Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Sauk County, Wisconsin:

BACKGROUND:

Sauk County recognizes that proper disposal of hazardous waste is important to the safety and well-being of County residents and the collection and proper disposal of hazardous wastes serves to protect the natural resources of the County. Sauk County has supported the Clean Sweep Program and hazard waste collection events held in the County for well over twenty years.

The Land Resources and Environment Department hosts one (1) Clean Sweep Event annually as well as several Ag Plastic events throughout the year to assist residents with the proper disposal of hazardous wastes. The Clean Sweep Grant Program through DATCP helps to defray some of the expense of disposing of the collected materials and provides a service to County residents that would otherwise be costly to individual households and helps to protect the natural resources of Sauk County.

The LRE Committee found the amendment reasonable and recommended approval of the amendment by the Sauk County Board of Supervisors.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission having considered that this land's highest and best use has historically been as agricultural land, and this land is between two single-family developments and that a comparable use as single-family is the best future use of this land;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Merrimac, Sauk County, Wisconsin, upon recommendation of the Town of Merrimac Planning and Zoning Commission, do ordain that the following amendments be made to the Town of Merrimac Zoning Ordinance and Maps:

Rezone the land identified as Tax Parcels 026-0202-00000 and 026-0204-10000, further identified as being a part of the Government Lot 3, the NW ¼ of the SW ¼, and Government Lot 4, Section 8, T. 10 N., R. 7 E in the Town of Merrimac, Sauk County totaling 128.1 acres, from the Agricultural District to the Single-Family Residential District.

This ordinance is effective on the day following publication per s. 60.80 and is subject to approval by the Sauk County board. The town clerk shall properly publish this ordinance as required per s. 60.80.
