  - b. Discussion of potential sub-groups names
    - i. Child Maltreatment Response Team (CMRT)
      - 1. Will include DEC (drug endangered children) and child abuse response team.
    - ii. Sexual Assault Response Team
    - iii. Domestic Abuse Response Team
      - 1. Using these names motion Spoentgen, second Rego, unanimous vote in favor.
  - c. CMRT discussion of DEC
    - i. Past issues about bring MOU together between LE and DHS/CPS.
      - 1. All chiefs and DHS have signed.
      - 2. Will seek clarification from CJCC Calkins about what needs to be done re: formalization of DEC meetings. Then, if formalization is needed per CJCC, will reach out to Miller/Zunker re: possibility of leadership role and standardization of meeting times.
  - d. DART discussion of lethality assessments v. revictimization assessments
    - i. Maryland LAP v. PRAISE
    - ii. In order to implement them, LE needs to be trained.
      - 1. Recommended to do at the agency level versus the county level
    - iii. Discussion of continued vision for the workgroup
      - 1. Broadening of scope to include high risk case reviews and to do continued analysis after assessment is chosen based on data derived from its implementation.
  - e. SART continue to do case reviews to address systemic problems that potentially aren't going the way things should be/
    - i. Case reviews should continue
    - ii. Implementation of victim surveys

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- iii. LE perspective Where we do the interviews has become an issue?
  - 1. Trying to streamline the process so the victim has the best experience problems kicking victims between agencies when there are issues with the initial reports of jurisdiction.
  - 2. Possibility of centralization of interviewing children among the agencies in the county (item moved to CMRT)
