The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Reinfeldt.

Reinfeldt asked for a motion to adopt the October 18, 2017 NFP Community Board Agenda. Fordham made a motion and Murray seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Reinfeldt asked for a motion to adopt the July 19, 2017 NFP Community Board Minutes. Bjorklund made a motion and Kirchstein seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Public comment: NFP Administrator and Supervisor from Columbia County here to observe CAB meeting to see how to implement their own. Their program began in June 2017.

**Business Items for Discussion and/or Action:**

**A. Reinfeldt to welcome and introductions**

1. Welcome and Participant Introductions: NFP Columbia County present.
  - i. **Program Update:** NFP is pursuing new NFP Nurse Home visitor position is going to be pursued for tax levy funding as the grant has stated they do not have anymore funding to offer at this time. Adams and Juneau NFP will not be making any changes to their grant budget. NFP client and husband successfully graduated Sauk County Adult Drug Court.
  - ii. **Sight Visit Highlights:** Nurse Consultant, Danielle, presented Sauk data to group and Sauk has the BEST retention of all her NFP sites in 4 states, 75% of visits are being done in the home, clients are enrolling around 17-28 weeks gestation, small number of premature and low birth weight babies, error with maternal smoking report. 91% of clients initiated breastfeeding, immunization rate is "low" compared to national data at 80% but compared to overall Sauk County 2 year olds at 64% it looks good. NFP has taken the "shot nurse" into the home to

get baby caught up on vaccines. Subsequent pregnancies in Sauk County is higher than national data as well as NFP in Adams and Juneau County. Dr. Delong spoke to concerns being addressed at Baraboo Dean Clinic with access to care. Possible barriers include: no discussion of birth control prenatally, lost insurance before 8 week postpartum assessment, scheduled postpartum assessment for after 8 weeks when insurance is lost, clients are sexually active before 8 weeks postpartum, partners want to have sex now, clients given birth control they don't intend to use, Dean Clinic not allowing teen clients <18 yo to be seen without a parent, horror stories about birth control on social media.

- iii. **CAB Time & Talent Survey:** Only 8 surveys received so far. Majority would like to help with special events like Mother's Day/Halloween Party/Christmas Party, one person could help more with CAB Meetings, one person wanted to get the Home Visiting Task Force going again, one person can't do more but does Advocate for NFP in the community and one person would like to be part of a short-term action team for Transportation and Housing.
