Were some issues with the equipment after the move, but most of the issues are now resolved.
- 10. Administrator's report. Kim updated the board on various activities of the HCC over the past month. Main focus has been on the budget. Board members commented on how well received Kim's budget presentation was at Finance Committee. Indications are that next year's budget will be challenging as well. Kronos payroll input by department managers began and is going well. SCHCC raised over \$7000 for the Alzheimer's Alliance which was the most money raised in the county. Foundation met and selected the artist for the stained glass windows and the cookbook was sent in to be printed. Held a family/resident meeting to update them on MDS 3.0 and it's ramifications for residents and families. Heard very positive remarks from family members and residents on the great staff and services the HCC provides.
