### INFLUENZA A UPDATE

As you know we have Influenza A in the building. If you have not yet received an influenza vaccination I highly encourage you to do so NOW. Those who have not received the vaccine must begin Tamiflu immediately. This will be at your own cost (it is a \$30 co-pay if you have the county's insurance).

Those who are not vaccinated must continue to wear masks when in the building. If you receive the vaccine, you must be vaccinated for longer than 2 weeks to be covered by the vaccine. Your best protection—Get Vaccinated! Also, wash hands frequently and stay home if ill. Before you return to work you must be home for a minimum of 24 hours after fever is gone without medication and feel well enough to return. Thank you for helping others remain healthy. Juli
