"Thirsty? You're already dehydrated"

As temperatures continue to climb, it's important to recognize the signs of dehydration. Dehydration stresses the body to work to retain fluids lost through sweat. It also affects the cardiovascular system, decreasing blood pressure and increasing pulse. The body can tolerate a one to two percent water loss but more than that can cause problems.

Watch for signs of dehydration that include:

- Excessive sweating
- Thirst
- Decreased urine output or dark urine
- Headache
- Fatigue
- Cramping
- Dizziness

If symptoms of dehydration are exhibited, take time to rest indoors or in a shady outdoor area while rehydrating with water. For our residents, make sure that they spend limited time outdoors and when they are outside that they consume adequate fluids.

Take care to keep yourself and our residents healthy and safe this summer season



Once in a Blue Moon ... is a common way of saying not very often, but what exactly is a Blue Moon? According to the popular definition, it is the second Full Moon to occur in a single calendar month. The average interval between Full Moons is about 29.5 days, while the length of an average month is roughly 30.5 days. This makes it very unlikely that any given month will contain two Full Moons, though it does sometimes happen. On average, there will be 41 months that have two Full Moons in every century, so you could say that once in a Blue Moon actually means once every two-and-a-half years. During July 2015 we have two full moons. They occur on July 2nd and July 31st.

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Ordering food from the SCHCC Kitchen

You have the ability to order food here at SCHCC for a very low cost. How to order food from SCHCC:

- 1. You must pick up an order form and pay at the front desk.
- 2. You then deliver your order form to the dietary department.

Lunch must be ordered and paid no later than 9:30 am.

Supper must be ordered and paid no later than 3:30 pm.

*Orders must be placed no later than 1 hour prior to pick up.

**Night shift staff can order food as well. Orders must be placed the day prior. Order forms can be found with the charge nurse. You must pay with your order form. (Exact change must be given as the charge nurse does not have any change to give.)

**Night shift staff will obtain their food order with the charge nurse's help, as it will be kept in the Activity Department's refrigerator.
