Restorative/Maintenance Tip Of the Month:

It is hard to make choices, follow directions or ask for help when your hearing is impaired, vision is limited, memory is challenged, or speech is difficult and need time to respond. We do a good job with meeting our resident"s needs, but it's always good to take a moment and assess our approach to make a change if needed. Bottom line, great communication means great follow through for maximizing skill potential.
