Restorative / Maintenance tip of the month: Balance

Maintaining balance is crucial in preventing falls and injuries. We start to lose our sense of balance as early as our 30's. People can have strong arms and legs, but the torso is what gives our entire body stability. Simple balance exercises can help. Hold on to a stable surface:1) stand on one leg for 30 seconds, switch legs, continue for another 30 seconds and repeat 3-5x. 2)Feet slightly apart, lift your heels off of the floor, 10-15 x. 3) Reaching and Stretching tasks. A person can increase skill by performing on uneven surfaces, closing their eyes and doing without "holding on". Incorporate balance into your day, for you and those you care for. Stay strong!
