Human Services staff will be attending briefings in the near future from the state regarding the closure of Lincon Hills Youth Prison and changes to the juvenile justice system.

#### Columbia County Human Services Juvenile Community Service Program

Staff from Columbia County presented information about their juvenile community services program that has been in existence for almost three decades. Key points are outlined below:

- Staffed by a part-time human services staff (22 hours per week)
- Referrals come from the circuit court system not from municipal courts.
- Not ordered in lieu of restitution. 15-25 hours typical.
- No fee to participate, but juveniles and parents sign an agreement about responsibilities.
- Countywide sites and developed. Juveniles are matched based on likelihood of success.
- County Liability covers all juveniles and locations. Their corporation counsel has endorsed this.
- No MOU with worksite providers and no background checks are completed.
- Clients are presenting with less support from home, increased mental health issues, and at a younger age than in the past.
- No specific offense information is share with work sites.
- Goal of the program is to build pro-social behaviors in these youth.

Sauk County is ready to rollout a version of a juvenile community service program, but the county liability issues still needs to be resolved. Human services staff will work with corporation council on this.

#### **Lincoln Hills Closure and Changes to State Juvenille Justice System**

The committee deferred discussion on this issue until we receive additional information from the state.
