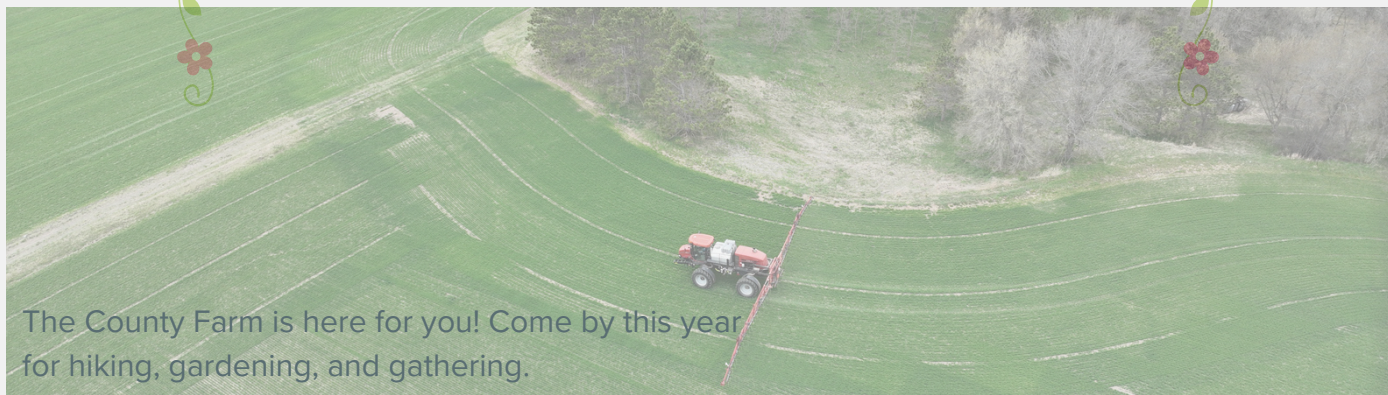


Prairie restoration on the Sauk County Farm and site of a future educational center for community programming.

Historic Firehouse

The historic firehouse is the last remaining building from the Sauk County Poor Farm & Insane Asylum in the 1920's. We have repaired and restored the outside of the building, while the inside will be used as a storage area for the community gardens.
