However due to Covid, the HCC discontinued providing meals and the ADRC established a month to month contract with Sauk City Catering for April, May, June and a portion of July. In Mid-June, the HCC indicated they would be able to provide hot meals to the ADRC; which meant we could reopen our

dining sites for carry out meals and the preparation of daily hot meal delivery. The HCC is not yet able

- to resume preparing frozen meals for our frozen meal routes, but dining center mangers have been ordering additional food and freezing meals at their dining sites.
- As we reopened, two dining center managers left, and most recently another left due to child care issues. Without dining site managers, we will need to return to frozen meal delivery, which currently is only available through our caterer in Sauk City. The difference between the meal costs is \$3.75 per meal.
- Paying dining center managers \$14.78 an hour plus FICA and WC comes to approximately \$13,400 for the remainder of the year. (48 hours @14.78 + FICA/WC x 17.5 weeks). Meals from the health care center (386 meals per week x 17.5 weeks) add another \$21,954 for a total of \$35,354.
- If the ADRC has to purchase frozen meals, the cost will be \$47,285 (386 meals per week x 17.5 weeks @ \$7.00 per meal).

The overall cost savings to the department is \$11,931 for the last 4 months of the year.

- D. What benefit will/does the position provide to the County? Describe the specific problem the position was created to address? How does the position improve/enhance customer service and/or address community needs? Please provide adequate data to support your position.
- Dining sites have been present in Sauk County since the Commission of Aging began. Senior dining is critical to the health of older adults.
- Older American's Act and our funder GWAAR's regulations state we must have a dining site manager at each dining site to oversee food safety and quality and to track all diners. The dining site managers are the "back up" to the meal and check in. If a home delivered driver attempts to deliver a meal and the client does not answer the door or respond to a phone call, the driver reports this to the dining site manager, who then reaches out to the emergency contact, or local law enforcement. This helps to ensure client safety.
- E. Indicate any alternatives to filling this position that were considered and why you still chose to request to fill?
- At this time, the only alternative is to purchase meals from Sauk City Catering since they are producing meals that meets the dietary guidelines the senior meals must meet.

The ADRC does not have extra staff to accommodate this need.

- F. What will be the effect if the proposed position is not filled?
- If the ADRC has to resort to providing frozen meals rather than the hot meals from the Health Care Center, it will cost more. Additionally clients like the hot daily meals much more than the frozen meals, so there would be disappointed clients.

- The ADRC surveys its clients annually to determine the client's satisfaction. The ADRC also reviews monthly meal counts to review any discrepancies.
