Tom Still is the president of the Wisconsin Technology Council, the nonprofit, bipartisan science and technology policy advisory board to the Governor and Legislature. The Tech Council's programs include the Wisconsin Innovation Network and other tech-based economy initiatives. Still is a senior lecturer in the Department of Life Sciences Communication in the University of Wisconsin - Madison College of Agricultural and Life Sciences. He serves on the Governor's Council on Workforce Investment and is active on advisory boards for such entities as the UW-Madison College of Engineering and the Waisman Center Biomanufacturing Center. The former associate editor of the Wisconsin State Journal, Still writes the weekly syndicated technology, economics and politics column, "Inside Wisconsin," which appears in over 24 publications.
