Each month from June through September we will hold grazing classes, or pasture walks, at a different farm exploring how they manage their animals on pasture.

The first class will be held on June 17th, 2014 10:00AM-12:00PM at Larry and Bridget Mundth farm, located at S4340 CTH S Reedsburg, WI.

Class Topic: How to Maintain Good Productivity in Your Pastures

Larry and Bridget are managing both dairy and beef herds on their pasture which has been in managed grazing since the early 1990's. At this pasture walk we will learn how the Mundth's maintain their long-term grazing system through:

- Management strategies, inter-seeding, rest periods and effective grazing lengths
- Pasture conservation practices used to help maintain their system
- Beef and dairy herd management practices
- Body condition scoring (BCS) demonstration to evaluate animal health and feeding efficiency by UW-Extension Agriculture Agent Katie Pfeiffer

Each student will receive a packet materials related to the topics discussed and lists of other resources to assist graziers.
