A Helping Hand at Home Fact Sheet

The Aging & Disability Resource Center of Sauk County (ADRC) offers the "A Helping Hand At Home" worker referral list to Sauk County residents and their families who request household help for indoor chores, outdoor chores, and respite care. Criminal background checks are conducted and references are checked at the time of application. The workers included on the "A Helping Hand At Home" list are NOT employed nor supervised by the ADRC.

How to Hire a Worker

Here are some things to keep in mind when you decide to hire a worker. These ideas are offered with your safety in mind! **Trust your instincts!** Please remember that this person will be coming into your home and you should never feel less than safe and comfortable in your home.

Develop a **detailed job description** - be specific in what you would like done. It is important to ask what the worker will be charging and if there will be any extra costs (such as gas or mileage). You will also want to check that your insurance provides coverage for inhome help.

Start with a **telephone interview**. Over the phone, describe the work in detail, be clear about your expectations, and ask about hours and wages. Also, this is a good time to ask about related past job experiences and if they have reliable transportation. During this call, do not give too much personal information - such as your last name or address. If the phone interview does not go well, it is not necessary to schedule a **face-to-face interview**. Thank them and tell them that you are interviewing other candidates and will let them know.

If you are satisfied with what you learn from the applicant, schedule a time to meet them. Request that they bring two or three references, a valid driver's license and/or proof of identity. If applicable, also ask them to bring their licenses and certificates. It can be a good idea to have someone with you during the interview. Their company will help you feel more comfortable, and they may also be able to give you another impression.

Concerns

It is important to notify the ADRC any time you have a question or concern regarding a worker in your home. **Trust your instincts!** Please remember that this person is coming into your home and you should never feel less than safe. Again, it is important to call Linda at the Aging & Disability Resource Center - 355-3289 - any time you have a question or concern.

The Interview

Before the interview, make a list of questions that are important to you. Try to ask the same questions to all the applicants. .

Interview questions could include:

- What days and hours are you available?
- What is your experience?
- What is your current employment situation?
- How flexible is your schedule?

- What kinds of special training, if any, have you had?
- What are your salary requirements? Is it negotiable?
- Would you ever have any occasion to bring someone with you?
- Would you agree to a trial period?

- What do you like about this type of work?
- Do you have reliable transportation?
- What if you can't be here at the agreed time?

References

It is not enough to just ask for references - **check them**. You should never hire someone without first checking their references. Speaking directly with former employers is better than accepting letters of recommendation.

Questions to ask applicant's references:

- How long have you known the applicant?
- What was their position with you?
- What were their job responsibilities?
- What was your impression of the quality of their work?

- Was this person reliable? Dependable? Courteous? Trustworthy?
- Were there any problems?
- Why are they no longer working for you?
- Would you rehire this person?

Communication

As with any relationship, communication is important. Being clear about your expectations can help to establish a positive working relationship. Despite every effort to keep communication open, problems can occur and persist.

Some signs of a problem include:

- The assigned work is not done
- The worker comes late and/or leaves early
- Personal items are missing from your home
- You do not feel comfortable with the worker
